


# Punctuation






Play **Punctuation Pow** to practice identifying ending punctuation (period, exclamation point, question mark).







Roll a die and travel that many spots on the game board. When you land on a punctuation mark, read your sentences and determine if one of those sentences should end in that punctuation. If you have a matching sentence, you can discard it from your hand! If you land on a POW square, you must pick up an additional sentence.

The first player to get rid of all of their sentences is the winner.
