**COMMAS RULES**

- Use a comma before a sentence begins with an introductory word or phrase such as well, yes, or, for example → No you may not spend the night with Ethan this weekend.
- Use a comma to connect quotations and speech tags. → "Well" replied Suzy "I didn't do it."
- Use a comma when a sentence begins with a dependent clause → because there were two ice storms we missed nine days of school this year.
- Use a comma to join two independent clauses with a conjunction. → "Well" replied Suzy "I didn't do it."


